In October Lutherans observe the Reformation.
Lutherans have a worship service where they sing robust guttural German sounding hymns about Scripture Alone, Grace Alone and Faith alone.
Lutherans believe these are the three themes of the Reformation.

Oh, wait! You do not know what the Reformation is. Simple, it is Halloween. On October 31, 1517 a monk by the name of Martin Luther nailed a document called the 95 Theses to a church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther's real concern was acceptance before God. It seemed he never felt loved by God. It seemed he never measured up to God or anyone else, especially his own father. He became obsessed trying to be accepted by God until he came along a passage in Romans which states: "For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law."

It changed Luther's life. He discovered he was already accepted by God. He did not have to try and please God. Instead, through the life, the death and the resurrection of Jesus, God was already pleased with and accepted Luther. What was true for Luther is true for the rest of us.

For the most part, realizing he was accepted by God through Jesus Christ took a big weight off Luther. He no longer had to prove himself to God. Neither did he have to prove himself to others. This does not mean life got easy. On one hand Luther was kicked out of the church and put under a penalty of death. On the other hand, Luther was no angel, he wrote some terrible things about others.

Anyway, here's my point. Reformation is not about singing guttural German hymns. It's not about drinking beer and eating brats. It's about me. It's about you. God has declared you and me accepted and loved through what Jesus Christ has done. That lifts a weight off our shoulders. That gives us a certain freedom. It frees us to love God and not be afraid of God. It also frees us to look at each other no longer according to our shortcomings. After all, Jesus has taken care of that stuff. But now we are free to see others according to what Christ has done for them.

That freedom makes us a better spouse, a better parent, a better child, a better friend. That's not just a Lutheran thing. That is a human thing.

From The President

Dear Friends and Family of Peace:

I realize that my letters as President of the Congregation have been few over the years that I have been blessed to serve as your President, but my constant thoughts and prayers have been with you all this entire time. I have always been so pleased to hear the Sunday morning reports of the various committee persons and what has been happening in our church. For a small congregation, we are remarkably active and people are committed to our missions and our in-house projects and Bible studies. Our Wednesday evening Council meetings are open to all members of the Congregation and are well attended by the chairs. The meetings are interactive with everyone feeling free to voice his/her opinion.......which can sometimes be a challenge to chair!

I had the privilege of attending a church service on Waikiki a week ago.....I looked for the church I had attended there many years ago. I discovered that the church still exists, though in a different location and in different circumstances; it once had its own home on the top floor of a high rise but was now meeting in a conference room in a small hotel. This little church has 32 active members and they were rejoicing in the fact that they had been able to raise \$250,000 to purchase their own space on Waikiki. They have bought a condo in a Waikiki complex for \$500,000 (which in itself is a miracle) where they are going to continue their mission in Waikiki. They have a loan of \$250,000 and already have commitments so that they plan to pay off the loan in three years. There were 22 members in attendance when I was there on the 7th and they all greeted my cousin Judy and me. There were guests from Australia, Baltimore, Los Angeles and Mexico. Following the service, the members had a project at a homeless center so many were wearing their gold "Prince of Peace Lutheran Church" t-shirts......including two fellas who looked as though they were "Fonzis of the 50s" with sleeves rolled up over their shoulders and tattoos down their arms......but, boy, could they sing the hymns and psalms! I talked to the two of them following services and they had similar stories of how they had happened to come to church one day hearing the music and "found Christ." You could not find two more committed Christians and it was a joy talking with them.

The reason I'm telling this story is that everyone with whom I spoke that day said how important it was for them to be in church on Sunday morning. They attend not only to participate and hear the word of God, but to support their fellow member Christians. This is the point I'm trying to get across and it merely reflects how I personally feel......I HAVE to go to church on Sunday morning (not because I think my parents are going to chastise me for missing when I get to Heaven), but because church on Sunday morning is my Anchor for the week. I really need to hear the Word of our Lord.....I need the Hymns......I need the prayers......I need to see my church family! It gives me the 'peace' I need to get through the week.

<u>PLEASE</u> make time in your lives to be' at Peace' on Sunday morning. The breakfasts, the games, the fun times considered more important..... they can wait. Our Christ is there for you....all the time......won't you be there for Him for just one hour on Sunday morning?
