Fellowship and Refreshments – Immediately following worship, coffee and other refreshments and treats are served in Luther Lounge (the lounge just off the entrance hall). Come relax with us and enjoy the company as we will certainly enjoy your company.

Holy Communion – At Peace Lutheran we celebrate Holy Communion on the second and fourth Sunday of each month. Holy Communion is a very special meal for the children of God in Christ. All who have been baptized and believe in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and all those who hunger and thirst for Christ's forgiveness and God's strength for living, are invited to join in Holy Communion. **Grape juice** (instead of wine) is available in the individual glasses in the middle of the tray. The wine is red; the grape juice is white. Pastor blesses any of the children who are brought to the communion rail. Any adults who come to the rail and desire a blessing but not communion may cross their arms and pastor will bless them.

Commemoration Of Saint Martin Of Tours November 11, 2018

Introduction

100 years ago today "major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, when the Armistice with Germany went into effect." Until 1954 this day was called "Armistice Day". Since then it is called "Veterans Day". The purpose of this change was to celebrate Veterans of all wars. Ironically, today is also the commemoration of Saint Martin of Tours who was a veteran of the Roman Army in the fourth century. Although Martin of Tours detested violence, he became the patron saint of soldiers. Once a year the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod awards to a military chaplain the "Bronze St. Martin of Tours Award" for exceptional meritorious service as a military chaplain. Today we highlight Martin of Tours' compassion as a soldier, then as a pastor of Jesus Christ. Thank you for worshipping at Peace Lutheran Church today!



Distribution (Please be seated)

Commemorations

November 11 - Martin, Bishop of Tours, died 397: Martin's pagan father enlisted him in the Roman army. Approached by a beggar, Martin cut his cloak in half and gave part to the man, whom he later understood as representing Christ. He asked to leave the army, but was jailed instead. After his release, he became a preacher, and later a bishop.

November 11 - Søren Aabye Kierkegaard, teacher, died 1855: Kierkegaard was a Danish theologian whose writings also gave rise to the modern philosophy of existentialism. He frequently attacked the complacency of the state church of his day, as well as its desire to be accepted by polite society rather than be a stumbling block.

November 17 - Elizabeth of Hungary, renewer of society, died 1231: Born in Hungary, Elizabeth was betrothed to the son of the Landgrave of Thuringia, and at age four was taken to be raised with him at the Wartburg Castle. Ten years later they were married. She was very generous to the poor, and after her husband's death she lived in cruel hardship until her own death at age twenty-four.
