We Gather In The Presence Of God

"Keep Watch" Matthew 25:1-13

In this text Jesus speaks in a parable of a wedding to describe the kingdom of heaven and Christ's return. This is part of the whole context of Matthew chapter 25, which is really about being prepared for the kingdom of heaven by remaining sincerely watchful, faithful, and loving. In this section we are told of a wedding party, 10 bridesmaids waiting for the groom to come so that they may join the procession to the banquet. Half of the bridesmaids are ready and well-prepared when the groom takes longer than expected, the other five we unprepared and ultimately rejected from participating in the feast. In this parable of the wise and foolish maidens Jesus' instructs Matthew's disciple community of the need for watchfulness, since it does not know the time of the return of the Son of Man. Thank you for joining in worship.

God Speaks Through His Word

First Reading - 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

Some of the Thessalonians are worried that dead Christians will be excluded from the resurrection to eternal life when Christ comes again. Paul reassures them with the word of hope that all Christians, living or dead, will be raised into everlasting life with Christ.

Pastor: ¹³We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those

who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. ¹⁴For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died. ¹⁵For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left

until the coming of the Lord, will by no means precede those who have died. ¹⁶For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. ¹⁷Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord forever. ¹⁸Therefore encourage one another with these words. ... This is God's Word

People: Thanks be to God.

Gospel Reading - Matthew 25:1-13

Jesus tells a parable about his own second coming, emphasizing the need for readiness at all times.

Pastor:

[Jesus said to the disciples:] 1"Then the kingdom of heaven will be like this. Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. ²Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. ³When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; 4but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. ⁵As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept. ⁶But at midnight there was a shout, 'Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' ⁷Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps. 8The foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' 9But the wise replied, 'No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves.' ¹⁰And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut. 11Later the other bridesmaids came also, saving, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' ¹²But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I do not know you.' ¹³Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour." ... This is the Gospel of our Lord.

Commemorations

November 11 - Martin, Bishop of Tours, died 397: Martin's pagan father enlisted him in the Roman army. Approached by a beggar, Martin cut his cloak in half and gave part to the man, whom he later understood as representing Christ. He asked to leave the army, but was jailed instead. After his release, he became a preacher, and later a bishop.

November 11 - Søren Aabye Kierkegaard, teacher, died 1855: Kierkegaard was a Danish theologian whose writings also gave rise to the modern philosophy of existentialism. He frequently attacked the complacency of the state church of his day, as well as its desire to be accepted by polite society rather than be a stumbling block.
