As We Gather

In last week's Bible reading from Philippians, Paul wrote in terms of empire to point to one more powerful than the Roman empire and its ruler, Caesar. Again, Paul uses terms of empire such as 'exalted' and 'Lord'. But Paul talks of an empire that comes not through force but through humility and the emptying of oneself. Today we baptize Heidi Dora Stein, the infant daughter of Dahlia and Sebastian Stein and little sister to Adrian. It is a simple and humble ceremony using plain water. Through this simple and humble act, the Holy Spirit does a powerful thing as Heidi is 'born from above' as child of God. Thank you for worshipping at Peace Lutheran today!





First Reading - Philippians 2:1-13 (Please remain seated)

As part of a call for harmony rather than self-seeking, Paul uses a very early Christian hymn that extols the selflessness of Christ in his obedient death on the cross. Christ's selfless perspective is to be the essential perspective we share as the foundation for Christian accord.

¹If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, 2make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. 3Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. 4Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. 5Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, 6who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, 8he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross. 9Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, 10so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. 12Therefore, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed me, not only in my presence, but much more now in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; 13 for it is God who is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

Commemorations

October 4 - Francis of Assisi, renewer of the church, died 1226: Born into the family of a wealthy merchant, Francis gave up his inheritance to serve poor people. He formed the Order of Friars Minor (called Franciscans), who took on poverty and the task of preaching "using words if necessary." Francis had a spirit of gratitude for all of God's creation.

October 6 - William Tyndale, translator, martyr, died 1536: Tyndale was ordained a priest in England, and wished to translate the Bible into English. He was opposed in this by King Henry VIII, causing him to flee to Germany. He completed the New Testament in 1525, but before he could finish the Old Testament, he was tried for heresy and burned at the stake.

October 7 - Henry Melchior Muhlenberg, pastor in North America, died 1787: Divided Lutherans in America asked leaders in Europe to send someone who could take charge and unite their work. Muhlenberg was sent, and was effective in organizing the American Lutherans.
